Abstract: Frederick G. Ross was an actor and business manager. His collection includes scrapbooks documenting the theater and actors and actresses of the 19th century. Also included is a portfolio of letters from the actor and stage manager William Gorman Seymour.

Creator History

Frederick G. Ross, actor and business manager for Lillian Russell was born in San Francisco, California in 1858. He began his stage career in 1879 appearing with actors such as James O'Neill, Edwin Booth, Ada Cavendish, John Drew and Joseph Jefferson. Leaving the stage, he became business manager for stars such as Lillian Russell, Fritzi Scheff, Margaret Anglin, Henry Miller and Rose Coghlan. He died in

Long Island, New York in 1942.

Custodial History

Wallace Munro donated the collection to the Billy Rose Theatre Division in 1942.

Scope and Content Note

The Frederick G. Ross Scrapbooks consist of 4 volumes of clippings documenting 19th century theater and actors of the day. Included as well is a portfolio of letters from William Gorman Seymour to Frederick G. Ross. The letters discuss events and happenings during the mid to late 19th century theater as well as personal items from the life of Seymour and his family.

This series consists of scrapbooks from the library of actor/business manager Frederick Ross documenting theater and actors and actresses from the late 19th century through the middle of the early 20th century. Included are clippings and some programs. One of the scrapbooks is entirely about Richard Mansfield and includes clippings and programs about his performances in *Peer Gynt*, *Beau Brummell*, *Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* and *The Scarlet Letter*.
