Abstract: Randolph Carter (1908-1998) was an American writer, director, and critic. The Randolph Carter papers date from 1860s-1997 (bulk dates 1930s-1980s) and contain manuscripts, typescripts, journals, photographs, letters, sound recordings, and programs.

Creator History

Randolph Carter (1908-1998) was an American writer, director, and critic. He wrote plays and theater reviews, television and film scripts, and non-fiction books. A few of his original plays were produced on Broadway such as *Eugenia* (1957) and *Arms for Venus* (1937). He was the stage director for the 1938 and 1939 Litchfield Summer Theatre seasons in Connecticut. He authored *The World of Flo Ziegfeld* (1974), *Ziegfeld: The Time of His Life* (1988), and *Joseph Urban: Architecture, Theatre, Opera, Film* (1992, co-written with Robert Reed Cole). Carter was also a World War II Navy veteran.

Scope and Content Note

The Randolph Carter papers date from 1860s-1997 (bulk dates 1930s-1980s) and contain manuscripts, typescripts, journals, photographs, letters, sound recordings, and programs.

The bulk of the collection consists of typescripts for theater and television, many of which were written by Carter, while others were collaborations or adaptations. There is a manuscript draft for *The Green Stick: Last Days of Leo Tolstoy* (1950s), and a few published versions of plays such as *Lenient in Love* (1983) and *Fish Cure* (1935).

Production materials such as programs, flyers, sound recordings, and clippings document the plays *Gabrielle* (1941), *The Late Late Show* (1960s, part of *Triple Play*), *Battle of Heaven* (1969), *The Green Stick*, and *Eugenia* (1955). There are also production materials for Carter's non-fiction projects such as book proofs for *The World of Flo Ziegfeld*; and chapter drafts, notes and letters related to the development of *Joseph Urban: Architecture, Theatre, Opera, Film*.

The collection holds drafts of an autobiography, a journal record from 1969 to 1997 about Carter's life and work, and personal letters and photographs. There are also materials related to his military service in the Navy during World War II, including medals, and a written recollection of USS Chauncey (DD-667) for his participation in a naval history project.
