Bayard-Campbell-Pearsall Collection

Introduction

The family and business papers of this collection are composed of mercantile papers, land papers, correspondence, accounts and other miscellaneous materials. Added to this collection are the papers of the Corned and Le Roy families and the papers of Jerome Sillem, a land agent for the firm of Bayard, Le Roy and Mc Evers.

The Bayard, Campbell and Pearsall families were related through marriage. There were members who were merchants as well as loyalists whose properties were confiscated and sold during the American Revolution. These people were forced to leave the American colonies and flee to Great Britain. However, after the war, they were permitted to return to America if they took the oath of allegiance.

These merchants traded with England, the Carribean and South America. The firm of Bayard, Le Roy and Mc Evers was a leading mercantile enterprise in New York City. It sold medicines, silk goods, liquor, earthenware and tobacco for the Peruvian market in South America. The merchants also brought and sold timber, spices, foodstuff, trees, apparel and hardware. Besides mercantile activities, they also engaged in the buying and selling of land, management of farms and many of those functions which a bank would perform.

The collection is divided into two series: Correspondence which is comprised of business and family letters and Accounts and Papers which contains bank receipts, bills, inventories and shipping documents. They are arranged in chronological order. The land papers have been separated from the latter series. They are arranged geographically by states. The bulk of these papers relates to deeds and maps of New York state; further arranged by counties. The New York City land papers are arranged by streets. The remainder of the papers are from other states. Included in this collection are accounts and notebooks; ledgers and a diary written by Catherine Le Poy Webster (1839).

Biographical Notes on William Bayard

William Bayard: 1761-1826. A New York City merchant and land developer. He was born in Greenwich Village; the son of Col. William Bayard and Catherine (Mc Evers) Bayard. Bayard was descended from Balthazar Bayard, a Huguenot.

--Colonel Bayard was first a merchant and landowner whose estate included nearly all the land where the city of Babylon, N.Y. stands. He was a Tory whose beliefs eventually forced him to move to England with his family except the younger William. He married Elizabeth Cornell, the daughter of Samuel Cornell.

On Dec. 1, 1786, Bayard formed a partnership with Herman Le Roy, they later took in Bayard's cousin James Mc Evers. A venture to Teneriffe for liquor was the first step to the development of the firm, which became the leading commercial enterprise of New York for 40 years. They traded with Europe, the East and West Indies. By 1822 they had several ships trading along the South American coast, taking advantage of the Latin American Revolutions. During the embargo imposed by President Thomas Jefferson, the firm turned to land speculation, the town of Le Roy, Genessee Co. is a reminder of that business.

Besides his real estate and mercantile activities, Bayard was able to serve as president of the New York State Chamber of Commerce, the president of the Bank of America and the president of the Morris Canal Co. He died after a long illness, leaving the firm to his two sons Robert and William Bayard.

Brief Biography

Herman Le Roy: ?-1844?. Merchant partner of William Bayard. He had done business in real estate. A town in Genesee County, New York is named after him. He also owned some mills in that county, most notably the Oswaja Lumber Association.

Brief Biography

Duncan Pearsall Campbell: 1781-1861. A New York City Merchant.
He married Catherine Bayard who died in 1813. He then married Maria Bayard in 1817. Both of these women were sisters whose father was William Bayard. His father was Patrick Campbell, a British Army officer and a loyalist whose land and property was confiscated during the American Revolution. Duncan P. Campbell's maternal grandfather was Thomas Pearsall and his paternal grandfather was Duncan Campbell who resided in Scotland.

Brief Biography

Samuel Cornell: 1733-1781. A merchant, landowner and the father-in-law of William Bayard. He was born in Flushing, L.I. (Queens County). In 1770 he was appointed a counsel by the Royal Court of Great Britain and was assigned to the province of North Carolina. There he resided in Craven County, Newbern Township. Because of his loyalty to Great Britain his property was confiscated. Later he and his family resided in New York City after spending some time in England.

His grandfather was Henry Pearsall who came from Staffordshire, England and settled in Hempstead. He and his son, Thomas C. Pearsall; 1768-1820 formed a partnership known as Thomas Pearsall and Son. His grandson, Duncan P. Campbell worked for them.
