Description Mr. Paul J. Mallmann was an American-born engineer and metallurgist. Principally a consulting engineer, he has done work for the governments of Japan, China, Germany, Russia and Great Britain. Mr. Mallmann's works were completed at the time of the First World War and the 1920s.

The major part of the collection relates to Mallmann's involvement in the development of the "Death Ray" for the British government for use in the war. Correspondence and memoranda concerning this project are present including papers relating to Mallmann's law suit against the British government after the war. There is also material concerning Mallmann's other engineering endeavours which includes his theory the "Mallmann Continuous Steel Process". Writings in steel production, Metallurgy and engineering are also included. There is material relating to Mallmann's interest in real estate in Virginia & Pennsylvania. Personal correspondence and notes from friends and associates are present together with newspaper clippings and telegrams. There is a good deal of printed ephemera such as train schedules, catalogs, pamphlets and guides.
